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**Abstract**—The purpose of this study was to determine the effect of a 10-week training program on the heart rate (HR) and energy expenditure (EE) of sedentary, middle-aged women. The subjects were 12 women, 40 to 50 years of age, who were sedentary and had no cardiovascular disease. They were randomly assigned to a 10-week training program or a control group. The training program consisted of three sessions per week of aerobic exercise at 60% of maximum HR. The control group did not exercise. The HR and EE were measured at rest and during exercise at the beginning and end of the 10-week period. The results showed that the training program had a significant effect on the HR and EE of the subjects. The HR and EE were significantly lower at the end of the 10-week period compared to the beginning of the 10-week period. The control group did not show any significant changes in HR or EE. The results suggest that a 10-week training program can improve the HR and EE of sedentary, middle-aged women.

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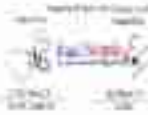
